A note from Pastor Meg...



I grew up in a neighborhood where most of the families attended the Roman Catholic Church. At this time of year, conversation in the schoolyard included the question "What are you giving up for Lent?" Common answers were "chewing gum," "chocolate," or "ice cream." I had a friend who announced one year that she was giving up orange pop because she didn't really like it anyway. I think she missed the point.

As the token Protestant, I never understood what they were talking about. My church, typical of most Presbyterian churches at that time, did not acknowledge Lent in any way – at least not in a way that a child would notice.

Over the years, many of us Protestants have learned the value of some of the traditions kept alive by our Roman Catholic brothers and sisters. Now I understand that Lent is a time for prayer and spiritual self-examination to prepare for the celebration of Easter. We use these days as a time to contemplate the suffering of Jesus, and to consider our role in that suffering.

"Because of our sins he was wounded, beaten because of the evil we did." Isaiah 53:5. Recalling Jesus' death makes real for us the consequences of our sin, and should move us to repentance. Acts of self-sacrifice help us participate in Christ's suffering, and acts of discipline strengthen us in the fight against temptation. So if we give something up for Lent, that self-imposed challenge can be a daily reminder of our need for Christ. Other disciplines can help us grow in faith -- fasting empties us, so that we might be filled by the Holy Spirit; prayer and reflection, which leads to repentance of our sins, clears away the things that get in the way between us and God.

How will you prepare to celebrate our Lord's resurrection at Easter? (Even though Lent has already begun, it is never too late to begin a Lenten discipline.) Perhaps you will commit to spending more time studying God's Word. Perhaps you can give up some time, focusing on the needs of others in service to them and to God. Perhaps you need to make prayer a more regular part of your day. Perhaps there is something you should "give up," as my schoolmates did, in order to free up more space in your life for God.

Whatever you feel called to do, I pray that God will bless you during this Lenten season.

Joel is headed to the state tournament!

Joel Makem will have some company in the second-ever sanctioned Minnesota State High School League girls state wrestling tournament.

The senior on the Shakopee wresting team won the 126-pound title last year and qualified for state again Feb. 11 in the Section 5, 6, 7 and 8 tournament in Sartell, along with her teammate, ninth-grader Cassy Gonzales.

Makem claimed the 132-pound championship, while Gonzales won the 126-pound division. Both went into sections ranked No. 1 in the state in those two weights.

Gonzales will take a 10-0 record into state, which will be held March 3-4 at the Xcel Energy Center in St. Paul. The girls' individual tourney will concurrently with the boys' competition.

Makem will go into state with a 9-3 mark.

At sections, Gonzales went 3-0 en route to her title, winning by fall over Jovanna Volker of Nashwauk-Keewatin-Greenway in the final. Gonzales also won in the quarterfinals and semifinals by fall.

Makem also won by pin in her title match over Faith Koning of Wadena-Deer Creek. Makem got a bye in the quarterfinals and won by fall in the semis.


2022 Nominating Committee: The congregation elected Carol Balvance, Barb Metz, and Miranda Gay to serve on Nominating committee as congregational members at large.

[pər ˈka-pə-tə]

A Latin term meaning "by head" that is often used in place of "per person" in statistical observances.

Per capita is a set amount of money—sometimes referred to as "apportionment", "by head" or "per member" that congregations pay to the larger Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) In other words; it is like a Presbyterian community fund, and it binds Presbyteries, Synods and Congregations together in one church. The per capita contribution per person for the year 2023 is \$37.50. 
