




Hope as an Anchor Hebrews 6:13-20

When life gets harder and the wind blows our life upside-down what do we do? What keeps us from tipping over the boat? When we are under tension and stress or feeling like facing a stormy sea, do we need hope?

We all face great storms in our lives like death, sickness, aging, doubts, fears, and an end of a relationships. The most devastating words in any language is to say or receive this message "there is no hope". When we go to the hospital usually the first thing we want to know is the diagnosis of our sickness, the most important thing is to hear how they can treat the problem. The scary thing is often not the name of the disease but to hear that is no hope, or that we are running out of options, or that we tried everything and it did not work.

Everybody needs hope, and hope needs belief, so we all need to believe in someone or something. You can imagine hope is like thinking that we are running toward bridges and not walls. Walls are telling us that we can't go anywhere or any further; or we are trapped here and there is nothing you can do. During the journey of our life we may have made bad or poor choices which left us with scars and holes in our life. Bridges are telling us there is something we can do to fill these holes in our life. Hope is about insisting that there is a bridge somewhere to connect the dots in our life so we can pass from the past to the future through the present.

When we throw our anchor of hope, we need to connect it to something that is solid and stable, who are you attached to? Who do you trust? Find people, things, and places where you can attach your anchor of hope to them. When circumstances get out of control and pressures threaten to overwhelm us, we know that God is here in you and in everybody who cares about you. You can trust God is working in your life even if you can't see the invisible hands.

Hope is not just a wishful thought, but it's real so you can feel it, Hope is visible so try to see it in you and in others. Hope is like a living plant so water it and it will grow deeper in your heart. Hope is a fruitful plant so you can harvest the fruits if you are patient. Give the plant of hope time to grow and to bear fruits for you and for others.

If everything's taken away from you, remember you still have something that nobody can take from you "Never give up hope" the Anchor of hope will hold you firm.

What is Per Capita and Why Should You Pay It?

Per Capita has been a part of our history for over 160 years.

It was first used to enable commissioners from all areas to attend meeting of the General Assembly.

Per Capita is an apportionment, a means of fairly sharing the costs of governance across the Presbytery, Synod and General Assembly.

It's not a tax, or an assessment, or "dues".

Yes, it is a voluntary offering, but to pay Per Capita is a responsible way to sharing costs that fairly belongs to the entire Presbyterian Church.

Shakopee First Presbyterian Church takes its responsibility very seriously and makes every effort to be good stewards of the gift you give.

Soon we will pay the 4th. quarter of our share of the Per Capita to the Presbytery.

We know some of you have paid the Per Capita, and we thank you for that.

It's not to late to consider to pay the \$ 37.50 to help offset your Per Capita by placing a check in our Sunday offering, with Per Capita, in the memo. We thank you for doing so.
