

Jeremiah 18: 1-10 Another Chance

We can see in this story that Jeremiah visited to the potter's house so he can listen to God's talk with through many ways. Sometimes God communicate with us through places or people who are not in our plan or beyond our human expectation. We expect God's talk to be in a supernatural way and we can easily miss God's voice because of our expectation. How many times have we thought about hearing God's messages in what we do in our daily life, or in what we see in different places, or in different people we meet.

Jeremiah is the example of the believer who is ready to listen to God's voice and to see things from a different perspective. Visiting the potter's house in the ancient world was like a normal activity and normal scene. God asked Jeremiah to listen and to keep listening as continuing process. While Jeremiah was listening, he was watching the process of making a vessel and he observed the relationship between the clay and the potter. Jeremiah learned the lesson visually and audio.

The potter tried to do his job as a maker of a vessel and something went wrong through the process. The potter took the clay remake the vessel. Life provides illustrations of the divine Word if we pay attention.

The Word of God is communicated through pictures, words, and through watching the common occupations of life. We are often rushing through this life so we have no chance to see or to hear God's voice unless we slow down to notice what is around us.

But there are messages about life from all of life, if we will just stop and listen.

What is significant about this passage is that Jeremiah received not one, but two words from God. At first he was told just to go down to the potter's house to watch him at work. So, Jeremiah went, and saw the potter's work spoiled and reworked. Only when he saw the result of his trip then the second word come from God. This second word understood the potter's rebuilding action as a symbolic of God's ability and interest in finishing (and rebuilding) the people of God. All of life, all of a people's history, was caught up in that one little image of a potter working his clay.

God is like the potter, He can put an end to the clay or reform it in whatever shape. The decision about the future of this clay depends on the flexibility and the acceptance of God's work to re-shape our lives and to rearrange our values to be the people of God. According to the text God is always working on doing things better reshaping our life if we are voluntary gave God the chance to work in us and through us.

I hear the warning words about not obeying God not as a threat but as a chance from God to us. God is working with us in life to share God's work in through all history. God is about listening, acting,




